From the Heart - A letter from Pastor Kurt

A continual discussion with people my age (and those a little older) is the surprise we have when we learn when the kids are going back to school. "In my day..." is usually the next words out of our mouths as we're shocked – shocked I tell 'ya – about how early school starts these days. This year, my 10-year-old goes back to school on August 15!

In many ways the church calendar is still setup for the school year to start after Labor Day, like school did when we were kids. While the summer is NOT a slow time for the church, it seems like many of the church programs don't get started until September or later – including people's attendance in worship.

As August closes in on September, I would encourage you to keep an eye on the church bulletin and website for all the exciting ministries that are re-starting or being created.

One of the key ministries here at Shiloh is our Wednesday Night Kids Club. On Wednesdays from 6:30 – 8:00, there are between 40 and 70 kids filling the building with energy and having what Sue calls "a lot of fun and a little Jesus." Most of these kids are not from Shiloh. They are from the neighborhood and attend church somewhere else, or more likely, don't attend church at all. This means that the only exposure they get to Jesus is on Wednesday nights at Shiloh.

This is a ministry that Jesus would embrace! Throughout the Gospel story, you see Jesus hanging out with people who don't hang out in church. Inviting people to grow closer to God in the midst of their daily lives or lifting up those who are not religious. Jesus would feel at home at Kids' Club.

This year, our new Youth and Young Adult Ministry Director, Sarah Pease, will be starting a Middle School program for those who "age out" of Kids' Club. This is an incredible addition, and I believe it will prove just as fruitful as Kids' Club.

DAILY PRAYER MINISTRY










Welcome Back!

Trustees Report

There is a committee of 9 people who are elected to 3 year staggered terms and they are known as Trustees. This committee is responsible for managing Shiloh's property. The Trustees are entrusted with managing a budget of just over \$383,000. That money includes maintaining all existing property and equipment. That includes deciding how best to fix things when they break and replace things when they can be fixed or they become too old to be useful. This budget also includes custodians and contractors who keep the place clean.

Because preschool has been on summer recess and things are quieter in the summer, the custodians have been busy "spring cleaning" the classrooms, John Wesley Hall and the gym.

We thought we should give the members of Shiloh an idea of what has been going on and how we are spending your hard-earned money.

Projects completed this year 2025

- The sound board, light controller and associated sound equipment in the Gym was replaced because of equipment failure.
- A leak was fixed in a Preschool classroom on the North side of the Education wing with the installation of a sump pump. This necessitated the installation of new flooring in the two classrooms on the north side of the preschool.
- The floors in the other two classrooms were stripped and waxed.
- All classrooms were thoroughly cleaned.
- New outlets and LED lights were installed throughout the preschool.
- The Youth room was repainted in the new addition, along with the hallways, restrooms and Theresa's office (old workout room).
- The youth room floors and the hallways in the new addition first floor were stripped and waxed.
- The Gym floor was scrubbed and sealed with three coats of sealer
- The carpeting in the new addition has been cleaned.
- Roaches were discovered in the JWH Kitchen and the Gathering space sink area. This necessitated the emptying of all cabinets so they could be sprayed. There were two treatments by Delhi Pest Control and all cabinets and counters were deep cleaned and floors and walls scrubbed.
- Last year we removed the old bushes between the parking lot and Foley Road and Ornamental Trees will be planted this fall where the old bushes were and rose bushes will be removed from around the old sign and replaced with hydrangeas. This is being funded by a group of Church Members.

- We also completed review of Shiloh's Safe Sanctuary Policy and are working on revising the Building Use policy.
- As I hope you can see, the Trustees have had a busy year and there is really no end in sight.

This couldn't be done without the hard work of the Trustees who are: Maria Coogan, Jennifer Brown, Joe Mirus, Sissy Galbraith, Jimmy Burdette, Paula Hunterman, Scottie Slayback and Rick Ayers. Also attending all our meetings are Bev Hansen who is Shiloh's Lay Leader and Pastor Kurt.

Also, about a year ago, the Trustees took over responsibility for the cleaning of the church and we hired a new Lead Custodian who is Jeremy Proctor. Jeremy has been a catalyst in getting this all done. He and the contract cleaner(s) have made a real difference in the appearance of this building without an increase in the budget. We could not have done all of this without his leadership and the assistance of Dominico Smith who works part time for the church. We also have a contracted company who is responsible for cleaning of the Education Wing at night. They have been working with Jeremy to make sure the Education Wing is ready for the next school year.

I am proud to be the Trustee Chair and am thankful that we have a group of 8 other people who are willing to jump in and help keep Shiloh a clean a vibrant facility. And of course, we couldn't do any of this without the offerings of those who belong and who attend Shiloh. So, my message to all of you is to enjoy your time at Shiloh and do what you can to help us keep the building clean and pleasant so everyone can enjoy it.



MISSION MOMENTS

Is it just us, or do the summers seem to fly by faster each year? The days are growing shorter, the temperatures are cooling, and the kids have already returned to school. But where did the summer go?

We are thrilled to share that we have renewed our three-year agreement with the Cambodian Government. Our dedicated office manager represented our organization and signed the agreement on August 9th, the same day Rick's oldest son, Max, celebrated his beautiful wedding to Jess in Glacier, Montana. We are profoundly grateful for our office manager's commitment, allowing us to partake in that special union of love.



As school begins here, it marks the end of the academic year in Cambodia. With Grade 9 and Grade 12 students taking their comprehensive exams, we are overjoyed to report that all of our Grade 9 girls passed and will advance to Grade 10. As we await the results of the Grade 12 exams on August 28 & 29, we hold onto hope for our girls, as their performance could open doors to college opportunities with full or partial scholarships.



In Cambodia, many face life one day at a time, often without plans for the future. We are determined to "change the story" by empowering our girls to set goals for the 2025-2026 school year. We have encouraged them to envision aspirations for school, personal growth, and health. Our counselors and social workers will meet with them monthly to support and celebrate their progress on this journey.



At Women Are Gold, our first priority is to keep girls safe. Our second priority is to keep them in school. At Women Are Gold, we are fiercely committed to ensuring that menstrual needs do not hinder our girls' education.

Period poverty is a term that highlights the struggle of many women and girls who lack access to essential menstrual products and the necessary education to use them effectively. Approximately 500 million individuals face challenges in managing their periods safely due to limited resources and the stigma surrounding this natural process.

In June, we were incredibly fortunate to receive 50 reusable sanitary packs, thanks to Shae at So Elements in Australia. Then in July, a generous grant from TheirWorld in the UK will enable each of our girls to receive 25 sanitary pads every month for a whole year.

We extend our heartfelt gratitude to those who stand with us in the fight against period poverty, recognizing its crucial link to education and empowerment.



We currently have 54 girls in our program and aim to reach 60 by the end of 2025. Each girl is at risk of being trafficked, and we are dedicated to keeping her in school and safe. By supporting her education, each girl receives vital monthly assistance, including tutoring funds, transportation costs, a food allowance, and school supplies.
