Dear Friends,

We will enter Lent on Valentine's Day! Lent comprises the forty days (not counting Sundays) before Easter. The forty days commemorates the forty days Jesus was tempted in the wilderness as he began his ministry. Lent is a time of meditation upon the sacrifices of Jesus. We respond to Jesus with repentance, gratitude, and awe. It is rather ironic that Ash Wednesday, which centers on our mortality, begins on Valentine's Day. When it comes to the great love of Christ, most of us love poorly. Who among us has not condemned someone while remaining blind to our own failings? Who among us has not withheld forgiveness while thinking it is automatic for ourselves? Who among us has not said "I will not give a dime" while thinking we are righteous for withholding? Do we even ask what God wants or assume that we know best?

Henri Nouwen observed, "The hard truth is that all people love poorly. We need to forgive and be forgiven every day, every hour increasingly. That is the great work of love among the fellowship of the weak that is the human family." We want to protect ourselves from hurt and being taken for granted. We hold on to being superior. We want to save our lives. Jesus warns that in saving our lives we can lose them.

The miracle of Jesus is not only that Jesus forgives us, but he enables us to forgive. Kate Bowler writes, "Let's try a gentle prayer of forgiveness. Perhaps someone comes to mind that we would like to forgive. Maybe we could say: 'Lord, protect me and change me as I seek to forgive." Generosity with our lives brings blessings.

Sanctuary Renovation News

Renovation of the Sanctuary began on Monday, January 15. A tremendous amount of work has already been accomplished. Demolition has been accomplished. Reworking lighting over the nave is in process. M & G Electric got the bid for the lighting saving thousands of dollars for us in the process. Rob Mirus is co-owner of M & G, the son of Joe Mirus. Joe Mirus is also doing some carpentry repairs. The plumbing for the parlor family restroom is now ready along with framing of the room. A new parlor doorway has been cut, giving another entrance into the parlor. This was necessary because we wanted to save the accordion room curtain. Hamilton County code required another door in case the accordion doors are shut. The sanctuary ceiling is being painted. At this moment, the renovation is slightly ahead of schedule.



With access to the Sanctuary not available, traditional worship has moved to John Wesley Hall. This has not been perfect, but we are doing the best we can. We have adjusted seating (the first week we had standing room only). With all the rain, there have been some leaks in the ceiling of John Wesley Hall. This is unfortunate, but they will be fixed when it stops raining. Thanks to all who make worship possible.

Capital Campaign

Michael Vilardo (Transforming Christian Ministries) is helping us with the capital campaign process for the Sanctuary Renovation Project. On January 9, twenty-five people attended a Campaign Cabinet Enlistment meeting. Our Capital Campaign will address the project need through three-year pledges to enable us to continue to grow in worship. We want to seek and share God's gift of oneness by involving as many people as possible. There will be numerous ways to give and serve. We are planning that May 5 will be the Commitment Sunday. We are excited about what God is doing at Shiloh United Methodist Church.

Hello, Shiloh United Methodist Church,

My name is Kurt Tomlinson, and I am pleased to let you know that Bishop Palmer has chosen me to be the next Pastoral Leader of your church. This past week, Rev. Jenn Lucas brought Elaine (my wife) and I to meet with your SPRC and we are thrilled to announce that the Tomlinsons will be coming to Shiloh on July 1. I truly appreciate Bishop Palmer and Rev. Lucas' thoughtful leadership and believe that they have made a very good decision.

Neither Elaine nor I grew up in Ohio. Elaine grew up in Connecticut and I grew up in Syracuse, NY. While I grew up in church, my first love was cars, and so I decided early on to make a career in the automotive industry and went to what used to be General Motors Institute and graduated with a Bachelor in Mechanical Engineering.

WOMEN ARE GOLD

Happy New Year! We are super excited to announce that in 2023, we trained 598 individuals in the community. This is very exciting for us, because at the beginning of 2023, the Cambodian government gave us a goal of training 200 individuals. At that time, we didn't think this was remotely possible. However, once we began training, and organizations, schools and government officials began hearing about our training programs, our training calendars filled up quite quickly.

We trained-

-54 young women in our "Diving Deep, Going Far", book study-an 8 week women's empowerment journey.

-164 school aged children in the "May & Bay" online safety game developed by A21.


-49 students in our SHINE + self-esteem program.

-177 individuals in Financial Management program- our most requested training program.

-66 individuals in our Safe Migration course.

-69 children in our "Good Touch, Bad Touch" program, that teaches school aged children about appropriate touch.

-19 young women in our Healthy Glow course that is focused on health, hygiene and wellness.



We also enrolled 15 young women into our Women Are Gold program. Our clients come from two different provinces in Cambodia, Kampong Cham Province (where we live) and the province next to us, Thbong Khmum Province. Our clients are some of the poorest of the poorest in these two provinces and range in age from 12 to 20 years old. Now that these young women have become our clients, each of them are enrolled in school, something that most of them were not prior to coming to our organization.

This year our goals, set by the government, are to train 400 new individuals in the community and obtain 20 new clients. Through prayer, partnership, and community engagement, we are confident that we can achieve these goals.

Rick is currently in Cambodia and as busy as ever. He has been visiting with clients and their families, joining the girls in some of their programs, meeting with staff to discuss cases, and preparing for the launch of a new project that will start in mid-February. We are so blessed that he is able to spend time at the project and do what we feel God has called us to do. Praise God for this opportunity.

Thank you for your continued love, support, and prayer. We could not be making this impact in Cambodia without you!
