

#### Information Meeting Concerning Division in the UMC and Lunch


April 23, Lunch 12:30pm, 1:00pm Information Sharing, Gymnasium

Many are aware that the United Methodist Church is splintering with churches leaving the denomination through a process called disaffiliation. The Leadership Council has decided to have a meeting for the purpose of giving accurate information. We hope all those interested would come to our lunch and meeting. To plan for the meal and setup, we would appreciate an RSVP to <a href="mailto:office@shilohumc.com">office@shilohumc.com</a> or call 513-451-3600. Shiloh is providing meat and we would like the congregation to bring a side. Some have already asked, "Can I just come to the meal or just come to the information session?" The answer is "yes." And if you cannot RSVP and want to come at the last minute, you are more than welcome. We are confident there is always room for more at the table.

What will happen at the gathering? Pastor John will offer a presentation on the history of how the United Methodist Church has come to such a point of division. Pastor John will outline some of the implications of disaffiliation. There will be discussion at tables. Questions can be asked. The purpose of the meeting will be to give information only. The Leadership Council voted soon after the 2019 General Conference not to make any decision regarding division until after the General Conference has adopted a plan. No one wanted to decide anything based on speculation or fear. Since that time, much has transpired. The Leadership Council wants to give information to help explain what is happening and to give perspective to some of the myths that are being circulated. A Design Team has met to plan the event. A special thanks to Tim Schoonover, Darlene Litteral, Dave Eyrich, Victoria Bloechl, Clyde Kober, Linda Roddy, Pastor John, Paula Hunterman, Bob Sears, and Katie Plumlee who have planned the event. We believe everyone will learn information that can help us in our prayers for unity and discernment.

# New District Names and Boundaries Announced Shiloh UMC will be in the Great Miam River District

When annual conference met in June 2022, members approved the reduction of districts in the West Ohio Conference from seven to six. *The Book of Discipline* authorizes the bishop "to form the districts after consultation with the district superintendents" (¶415.4), while giving the annual conference the authority to determine the number of districts.

A task group, assigned by Bishop Palmer, included representation from each of the seven existing districts. Working with the district superintendents, the task group created new district names and boundaries. These districts will focus on new ways to do mission and ministry as The West Ohio Conference of The United Methodist Church.

**Effective July 1**, the new district names and clergy who will serve as district superintendents are:

- Great Miami River District Rev. Jenn Lucas
- Hocking River District Rev. Mark Chow
- Maumee River District Rev. Amy Haines
- Olentangy River District Rev. Dr. Tim Bias
- Scioto River District Rev. Calvin Alston
- Western Lakes District Rev. Dr. Jim Wilson

District names were chosen because the image of water encourages Christ followers to remember their baptism and renew their commitment to God and to discipleship — with the help of the Holy Spirit.

We will miss our churches in Clinton county but know that you will be in good hands in the new Scioto River District. As Butler, Clermont, Hamilton and Warren counties become the Great Miami River District, we look forward to welcoming over 50 new churches from Greene, Montgomery and Preble counties.

Katie is our Administrative Assistant and is married to Justyn. The family has endured numerous health problems. Justyn is in stage four liver failure and cannot work presently. If you cannot be present on May 14 or would like to make your contribution early, write a check to Shiloh UMC and write "Plumlee Family" on the memo line.

Hello! First and foremost, I want to thank all of our Shiloh family for all of the prayers and support over the last several months. My family is so grateful. For those who don't know me or much of what has been going on, I thought I'd give a brief update.

To introduce my family, my name is Katie Plumlee (Noble), and I am the current Office Administrator at Shiloh. I grew up attending Shiloh and have hundreds of fond memories during my time in youth group. I was confirmed at Shiloh and married at Shiloh. My husband, Justyn and I have five children. Hailey (16), Caleb (12), Liam (9), Lydia (5), and Natalie (2). Our boys are both active in youth activities and the girls enjoy events such as VBS. Hailey likes to volunteer and babysit for events as well.

About a year ago, Justyn became very ill and was hospitalized. It was discovered that his liver was not functioning properly, and he was in acute liver failure. He has had several surgeries and multiple hospital stays due to the liver disease. He has been unable to work due to the strain his body is under. He was recently hospitalized, and the doctors predict he will need a liver transplant within a year. We are currently waiting on approval from insurance to get us into the correct hospitals to see a transplant team and start his treatment plan. For now, medications have been adjusted and seem to have made him stable. In the midst of all of this, I have started having health issues as well. I have been having numbness and tingling in my extremities, accompanied with dizziness and brain fatigue. I have undergone several testing sessions and am still awaiting a proper diagnosis. I will be following up with a neurologist later this month and hoping for a good outcome.

On top of Justyn and my health issues, we have FIVE children! It seems someone is always coming down with something. Hailey had pneumonia, Caleb had a concussion with stitches (and a broken foot last year), Liam has multiple appointments for his cochlear implants, and the little girls seem to get a cold every time we turn around. A doctor once described our house as living in a petri dish due to all the kids being in different schools, and I think that about sums it up!

Our family has been truly humbled by all the love we have been shown. I am unsure what the future holds but do know that we have a long road ahead. We have kept our faith and believe in the power of prayer. It has been hard to ask for help, but warms our heart to know that our Shiloh family is here for us. Thank you for all you have done and are willing to do for our family.



# MISSION MOMENTS

#### **WOMEN ARE GOLD**


We continue to have the wonderful opportunity to do a variety of training programs in the community. This month our first training opportunity was at Friendship Christian School, where we taught an online safety game to fourth and sixth graders. This game is an age-appropriate, interactive simulation game that teaches young people how to spot the signs of online grooming and recognize the tactics that traffickers employ. We were thrilled to have 46 students participate in this training session. The students enjoyed the game so much that they asked if they were able to play it at home too.

We also finished another community book study on the book "Diving Deep, Going Far". We had a lively celebration with the students of our class at the local chicken restaurant. As these young women talked about what they enjoyed about the class, they all said they felt encouraged by the book and supported by our staff, two things they don't get at school. These girls asked what other programs we could share with them and when they could begin.

We continue to receive new clients. This month we received two new clients, for a total of ten clients enrolled in Women Are Gold.

And, after many attempts at submitting our paperwork to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs, to legally work as an international non-profit organization in Cambodia, the Ministry has finally accepted our documents. Now we will wait to see if they approve what we have submitted and agree to sign a Memorandum of Understanding with our organization. This is our final step toward becoming an official organization in Cambodia.
