From the Heart - A letter from Pastor Kurt

It's been a busy couple of months for me, culminating with a trip to Nashville, Tennessee with the Youth Group on a week-long mission trip. You'll see pictures and descriptions of the trip elsewhere in this newsletter, so you can see all the great work that was done by our young people in Nashville. People say all the time that the youth are the future of our church. I want to disagree just a little bit. While we hope and pray that people who are young will eventually become adult leaders in our church, the reality is that THESE youth will probably be leaders in churches somewhere else – like me, many adults don't live where they grew up. These young people are leaders and examples for our church RIGHT NOW. Taking a week from their summer to go and work in 90-degree temperatures for people they have never met and will never see again is truly an example for all of us to follow.

Being my second week of mission this year, and after going to Team Hope a few times this year and seeing all the good work the kids have done from Wednesday Night Kids' Club and VBS, I wanted to share with you why this is all very important.

Our founder, Jesus, was very clear that how we treat the poor matters. I could quote many scriptures, but many will remember the famous like from Matthew 25:40, "Truly I tell you, just as you did it to one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did it to me."

In Acts 1, just before Jesus ascended into heaven, he gave the disciples one last instruction, and in that instruction, he gave us the plan for mission work. Acts 1:8 says, "you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." In this, Jesus tells us that we need to be in ministry here at home (Jerusalem), in our neighborhood (Judea), in our neighboring communities with those who we disagree with (Samaria), and indeed in places that are far away (the ends of the earth).

Truly our young people are leading the way and showing us what it's like to follow this Acts 1 vision of mission. We are so thankful for their example and leadership and we can commit to follow. As we grow in missions, through Team Hope, through Women Are God, through LIT, and through new mission partnerships, we will truly live into Jesus' vision of being His witnesses in the world.

Keep your eye out for new and exciting ways that all of us, children, youth, and adults, can truly be in ministry to the world.




Serve Sunday

MISSION MOMENTS

Happy summer! It's wonderful to be back in Cincinnati and to enjoy all the joys of summer, even the hot weather.

Since we left Cambodia, our staff have been blessed with the incredible opportunity to host four visitors: Sandy and John from Australia, and Jason and Halle from Fort Wayne, Indiana. Each of these visitors came to Women Are Gold to spend time with our staff and beneficiaries, learn about our organization, and witness firsthand how we are "changing the story" for individuals in Cambodia. We are truly grateful to have had these amazing people visit our community center and share their love, encouragement, and blessings with our extended family.





In between these visits, our staff have been very busy training individuals in the community and registering new beneficiaries. In June alone, we trained 188 individuals in various programs and registered six new beneficiaries into our organization. We are forever thankful and honored to have a team committed to our mission and vision, dedicated to preventing human trafficking in Cambodia.



Later in the month, an individual arrived at our community center desperately seeking help. This woman had heard about our organization from a friend and was hopeful that we could assist her after becoming involved in an online scam. Our staff listened to her situation and realized that they had never encountered anything of this magnitude, although they had been warned about such issues in their professional training. Wanting to help her, our staff reached out to contacts at the local police and anti-corruption department for assistance. Local authorities came to our community center to discuss the situation and develop an action plan moving forward. The woman felt relieved by the new plan and was extremely grateful for our assistance, while our staff gained valuable insight into the process of dealing with online scams.



Rick and I plan to enjoy the summer in the USA and head back to Cambodia in early fall. Before we return, we will hold two Q&A sessions about the progress of our work and our future vision. The dates and locations for these sessions will be announced soon. We hope you will be able to attend one session.

God continues to bless us, our mission, and our families-here and abroad-and He continues to do abundantly astonishing things beyond what we could have imagined. God is good.
