A letter from Pastor John

"Consider the lilies of the field, how they grow; they neither toil nor spin; yet I tell you, even Solomon in all his glory was not clothed like one of these."

Matthew 6:28

Dear friends,

Springtime is upon us. Flowers are blooming, trees are budding, and the landscape speaks of generosity and beauty. I like the changing of the seasons. Easter has been celebrated. Death and fear are not the last word. Life and hope are spoken into our souls by the Spirit of the resurrected Christ.

As Jesus spoke the words above, I believe they reflected his eye for beauty and appreciation of creation. Jesus said, "The eye is the lamp of the body. So, if your eye is healthy, your whole body will be full of light." Life is about perspective. Jesus saw that people were worried about money, security, and necessities like clothing. Jesus challenged the people to seek first what God wants and then assured them that all they were worried about would find its proper place.

Jesus lived out of Oneness with God. Jesus said you cannot serve God and wealth. Jesus said, "Ask, and it will be given you; search, and you fill find; knock, and the door will be opened for you." In other words, as our perspective matches the mind of Christ, we ask for what God wants.

I have been praying, "Lord, what do you want to do through me to fulfill your will for Shiloh?" This prayer has helped my perspective. I have plenty to worry about—buying and selling homes, moving, taxes, uncertainty, impending retirement, fatigue, sleep, how to fix things, relationships, maintenance of vehicles, and what to prioritize. God has used this prayer to turn me from centering my life on all I have to do to what God wants to do through me for the benefit of God's people. God has used the prayer to point me toward worship and appreciation.

One of the benefits of the Capital Campaign has been listening to the stories of how people came to Shiloh and why they have remained. People remain at Shiloh because they have felt the presence of God. God has called us to give and forgive. God has called us to trust and serve. God has called us to worship. We refuse to be bitter. God has called us to comfort others. We refuse to judge. God has called us to behold the beauty of people.



Nuru Ya Mapendo (NYM) News Concerning their First Decade of Work

Shiloh Supports Jane Wise, Missionary to Kasenga Democratic Republic of the Congo

Did you know?

- 1. NYM has constructed or repaired 15 of the 17 UMC churches in the Kasenga District?
- 2. NYM has constructed 3 schools in the district, benefiting 1500 children & giving jobs to 27 teachers/administrators?
- 3. NYM has commissioned 72 pews, 150 school desks & 24 tables for this work?
- 4. NYM has created a beautiful compound for the district, which includes a ministry center, prayer room, offices, library, computer & conference room?
- 5. NYM has commissioned 2 wells, one benefiting the ministry center and the other benefiting students & the community?
- 6. NYM has constructed 3 toilet buildings benefiting hundreds of students & church members?
- 7. That NYM has benefited hundreds of people in the community through humanitarian aid such as shelter, new roofs, clothing, food, medicines and surgeries?
- 8. That NYM has installed provided electricity & running water to the two largest facilities in the district which service hundreds of people each day?
- 9. That NYM grows 3 community gardens on site which provide food for the hungry who come through our doors?
- 10. That your missionary has visited each church in the district multiple times each year to give a message & words of encouragement?
- 11. That NYM has built 3 homes and purchased one home for people in need?
- 12. That NYM has provided 6 people with jobs so they can provide for their families?
- 13. That NYM has created a plan of succession, with 3 generations working for God's glory?
- 14. That your missionary spends 2 months every year planning for and traveling to churches in multiple states to share NYM's work?
- 15. That the Board members of NYM donate their time & resources to follow our work, oversee finances, communicate our needs and pray for us?

Other facts:

- 1. Over \$500,000 was raised the first 10 years.
- 2. Over 1,000,000 bricks & 4500 sacks of cement were used in construction.
- 3. Three outreach events were given bringing 90-100 people to Christ.

This month we went to New Life Church, Soung City, to teach their leadership and congregation about our financial management strategies. Many of all ages were in attendance and the class was very perceived and helpful. We look forward to hearing some feedback in the future about families rising from poverty to financial stability by using our methods. We have confidence that these families can make a positive change.









Rick is still very busy in Cambodia, assisting the staff with new client registration, preparing for the launch of our new projects, meeting with potential partners and supporting our team in their daily activities.

On Palm Sunday, Rick was invited to deliver the morning message to approximately sixty young people at Strong Nation Church in Kampong Cham. He delivered the message in English, and it was translated into Khmer by a gracious translator. Thank you, Strong Nation for your hospitality.


