From the Heart A letter from Pastor John

An Unlikely Advent

Rachel Billups writes, "In this Advent season, I cannot help but especially remind those of you who experienced great loss that God is mindful of you. Immanuel, God is with us."

Dear Friends,

I often pay attention to the first line in a book. Good first lines hint at the theme of the book. They draw us into the story. The first line in the Bible reads "In the beginning when God created the heavens and the earth, the earth was a formless void and darkness covered the face of the deep, while a wind from God swept over the face of the waters." This first line tells us that God is creator and intimately involved in creation. In the book *The Road Less Traveled* by M. Scott Peck, the first line is "Life is difficult." Who can argue with that?

We all experience loss. We find ourselves in places that feel dark, uncomfortable, confusing, and the next step is perplexing. The second sentence in the Bible is "Then God said, 'Let there be light'; and there was light." God has us in mind. God intervenes with truth and lights the way forward. The first line in the Gospel of John says, "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God." In other words, the divine creative energy of God, the Logos, is one with God, is God, and has voice. The Word is identified as Jesus, the one who spoke creation into existence, the light that shines in the darkness.

During the season of Advent, we remember that the Word became flesh, the supreme act of love. The situation of that "first Advent" was dark. The Roman Empire ruled much of the world with an iron fist of domination. The people of God were living in an occupied country under a tax burden that caused many to lose their homes and land. Unfortunately, numerous religious and political leaders aligned themselves with the prevailing powers, adding to the burden of injustice. Common folks yearned for the Messiah, the promised deliverer. They often wondered if God had forgotten them. They were hungry, sick, tormented, and fearful. The first line in the Gospel of Mark answers, "The beginning of the good news of Jesus Christ, the Son of God." Advent means God comes into our world. God brings good news with the unlikely advent of becoming human. Contemplating this mystery humbles and astounds us.

God intervenes in our lives far more than we realize. We will examine this truth through the study and sermons based on the book *An Unlikely Advent* written by one of Shiloh's former pastors, Rachel Billups. I invite you to pray with me this Advent season, "Beloved, enable me to recognize your intervention into our lives." The Book of Revelation concludes with Jesus saying, "Surely I am coming soon!" The writer proclaims, "Amen, Come, Lord Jesus! The grace of the Lord Jesus be with all the saints. Amen."





WOMEN ARE GOLD

This November brought many new and exciting things to Women Are Gold.

After many months of interviews, background checks, reference checks and thorough reviews of our Child Protection Policies, we are thrilled to announce that we were given the gold stamp of approval and have been accepted into the elite coalition with the organization, Chab Dai.



Chab Dai (which means "joining hands" in Khmer) was founded in Cambodia in 2005. Their vision is to see individuals, organizations and agencies work together toward addressing human trafficking and exploitation. They do this by building upon the Biblical framework of working together as the body of Christ, in addition to frameworks for basic human rights. Chab Dai seeks to raise the standards of advocacy, prevention and care utilized by individuals, organizations, businesses, researchers and government agencies in addressing human trafficking and exploitation. Women Are Gold is honored to have a partnership with Chab Dai.

We have added another two clients to our case load this month, bringing our total client case load to 17 young women. Over the course of the coming year, we plan to double our client case load and client reach to make our services available to as many vulnerable young women as possible.



Our fourth SHINE program was held for the year, and this time we are excited to share that we had some boys who were interested in joining this program. Three boys and eleven girls spent their days learning about their worth and how God loves them and



sees them as a vital part of his plan on this earth.

We are over the moon excited to share the news of our newest addition to the Women Are Gold family. At the beginning of November, our accountant, Malen, gave birth to a beautiful baby boy. Congratulations to Malen and her family on this precious gift from God.

We have so much to be thankful for. God is good.


